The Annual Parish Meeting was held on May 23rd, followed by a Parish Council Meeting.

At the Annual Meeting we said farewell to Councillors Arthur Peake, Ian Sadler and Richard Dewhurst.

Arthur was thanked for his dedication and hard work as Chairman, having held this position for nine years and reports were given by the Parish Council, All Saints Church, The Lord Thurlow Hall, and the WI.

This was followed by the Parish council meeting which was chaired by Mark Taylor as acting Chairman, it was decided that an acting Chairman would be elected for each meeting for a while. The meeting was not as normal as we had no Clerk, but hopefully by the time this goes to print the situation will be resolved.

Obviously with the retirement of Councillors and Mark Taylor's imminent departure, there was space for new councillors. ## **Emergency kit for severe bleeding**

We are extremely grateful to have been gifted an Emergency Bleed Kit for our village. Many thanks to Di and Roy Barker.

The box is situated at the front of The Lord Thurlow Village Hall, near the defibrillator. It is there for the public to use in case of catastrophic bleeding, as this is time-dependent and life-threatening. ALWAYS call 999 first and send a someone else to collect the kit, NEVER leave the injured person alone.



The 999 responder will explain how to use it, but instructions are inside. There is a tourniquet for limbs, as well as a trauma dressing for wounds.

Collect everything from the cabinet and take it to the patient. Take the defibrillator too as this will be an emerency. You can use it without any training, so don't forget these life-saving bits of kit are there for us to use.

# **Dear Residents**

Mid Suffolk needs a Local Plan in place to ensure that residents have a greater say in planning decisions.

#### Our planning system

A lot of residents ask why planning permission has been granted for a new estate or why particular elements in a development are missing. There is a mistaken belief that your local Council has all the decision-making power.

The government's National Planning Policy Framework controls much of planning policy and Councils must work within this framework.

Local voices are not always represented strongly enough in the planning process. In order to rectify this Mid Suffolk has been working on a Local Plan that gives more control over development in the District. The first part of this plan was signed off last year.

#### Site submissions for future development

The next part of the Plan requires Mid Suffolk to request any residential site submissions for future development. The initial submissions are currently being reviewed and can be found at https://www.babergh.gov. uk/w/call-for-sites

This exercise flushes out all possible sites - it doesn't mean that a proposed site is acceptable.

#### Supplementary Planning Documents

Mid Suffolk District Council is also creating Supplementary Planning Documents on subjects such as Biodiversity and Trees and Affordable Housing. These are designed to provide best practice to developers.

#### Local listed building consent

On a slightly different but related topic, Mid Suffolk are working with Historic England on the adoption of a local listed building consent order. If approved this will enable owners of listed buildings to apply specific energy efficiency measures to their homes without onerous planning requirements.
